

The Pelham City Council convened at 7 p.m. Monday, April 19, 2004. Mayor Hayes called the meeting to order, and Karyl Rice led the invocation. Mayor Hayes asked that the record show all members of the council present.

Rosemary Metcalf moved to waive the oral reading of the April 5, 2004 minutes and approve as written. Karyl Rice seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

During old business Ordinance No. 135-152 was presented changing the present zoning of R-1 Dwelling District to M-1 Light Industrial District on property located at 461 Highway 361. The applicant was Barbara Cupp. No one spoke in favor of the rezoning. Karyl Rice moved to deny the rezoning request. Jim Phillips seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Ordinance No. 135-153 was presented changing the present zoning of R-1 Residential District to Special District on property located at 825 Highway 361. The applicant was Kerry Carter. Mr. Carter explained the layout for 70 lots on 20 acres with homes valued at \$200,000. Karyl Rice reported that the Planning Commission voted unanimously for the rezoning and moved that the city council approve Ordinance No. 135-153 as presented. Jim Phillips seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

During new business, an agreement and resolution was presented for traffic signals and street lighting modifications for SC 52 and SC11. Willard Payne moved to approve the agreement and resolution as presented. Jim Phillips seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Mayor Hayes read a proclamation naming the month of April, Sexual Assault and Rape Awareness Month and presented the proclamation to Cathy Keel from SafeHouse.

Mayor Hayes announced Pelham Pride Day on April 24 and Youth Government Day May 3.

With no other business before the council Rosemary Metcalf moved to adjourn. Jim Phillips seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.
