Ordinance No. 202 annexing Chester and Margaret Puckett's property was introduced. Karyl Rice moved to suspend the rules for immediate consideration. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and a roll call vote was taken with all council members voting yes. Thereupon Willard Payne moved to approve Ordinance No. 202 as written. Jim Phillips seconded the motion and all approved.

Ordinance No. 203 transferring the cable franchise from Insight Cable to Cencom was introduced. Jim Phillips moved to suspend the rules for immediate consideration of Ordinance No. 203. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and a roll call vote was taken with all members of the council voting yes. Thereupon Karyl Rice moved to approve Ordinance No. 203 as written. Jim Phillips seconded the motion and all approved.

A resolution was introduced advancing \$200 to Fire Department personnel while attending Smokedivers School, May 14-18, 1990 in Ocala, Florida. Willard Payne moved to approve the resolution as presented. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

A resolution advancing \$100 to Sgt. Mark Delk while attending the Juvenile Policy Seminar in Knoxville, Tennessee May 14-18, 1990 was introduced. Willard Payne moved to approve the ordinance as presented. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and all approved.

Mayor Hayes read a proclamation naming May 8, 1990 National Teacher Day.

Several candidates for political office appeared before the Council and asked for their consideration in the upcoming election.

With no other business before the Council, Karyl Rice moved to adjourn. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and all approved.
