

The Pelham City Council convened at 7:00 p.m., May 29, 1990. Mayor Hayes called the meeting to order. Karyl Rice opened the meeting with prayer. A roll call was taken with all members of the Council present.

Ken Maynard moved to approve the minutes of the May 7, 1990, meeting as written. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and all approved.

There was no old business to come before the Council.

During new business, Ordinance No. 204 annexing Charlene Quinn and J. A. Brown property was introduced. Ken Maynard moved to suspend the rules for immediate consideration. Willard Payne seconded the motion and a roll call vote was taken with all members of the Council answering yes. Thereupon Willard Payne moved to approve Ordinance No. 204 as written. Karyl Rice seconded the move and all approved.

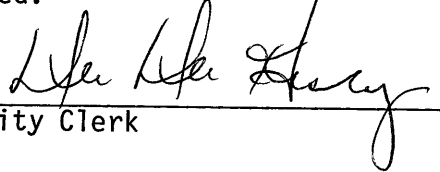
Ordinance No. 205 requiring the use of automatic sprinkler systems in hotels/motels was introduced and will be voted on at the June 4, 1990 council meeting.

Ordinance No. 206 annexing Donald R. Murphy property was introduced. Karyl Rice moved to suspend the rules for immediate consideration. Jim Phillips seconded the motion and a roll call vote was taken with all members of the Council answering yes. Thereupon, Jim Phillips moved to approve Ordinance No. 206 as written. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

A request to purchase the Village at Pelham was made by Birmingham Realty. Jim Phillips moved not to pursue. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and all approved.

A public hearing was announded to be held June 4, 1990, at 7:00 p.m. to consider an amendment to the zone district boundaries of the City of Pelham so as to change subject zoning from the present zoning of A-1, Agricultural District to M-2, Heavy Industrial District. The property is located across Interstate 65 from McCain Parkway. The applicant is Mr. Wayne McCain.

With no other business before the Council, Ken Maynard moved to adjourn. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.
