

The Pelham City Council convened at 7:00 p.m., September 17, 1990. Mayor Hayes called the meeting to order. Ken Maynard opened the meeting with prayer. A roll call was taken with all members of the Council present.

Ken Maynard moved to approve the September 10, 1990 minutes as written. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and all approved.

Mayor Hayes recognized Odis Amason and Boy Scout Troop 404.

During Old Business, Ordinance No. 130-6 was presented. Karyl Rice moved to approve the ordinance as written. Jim Phillips seconded the motion and all approved.

An application for retail beer (on or off premises) for Pig Sickle was presented for consideration. Ken Maynard moved to deny the request due to its close proximity to residences. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

A resolution was introduced approving the location of a traffic light at Highway 119 and Cahaba Valley Road at no cost to the City. Jim Phillips moved to approve the resolution as presented. Willard Payne seconded the motion and all approved.

An application was presented for a Lounge Retail Liquor - Class II license for Freeway Express Bottle Shop. Ken Maynard moved to deny the request. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved with the exception of one council member.

An application for retail table wine and retail beer (on or off premises) for Freeway Express - Unocal 76 was presented. Ken Maynard moved to deny the request. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

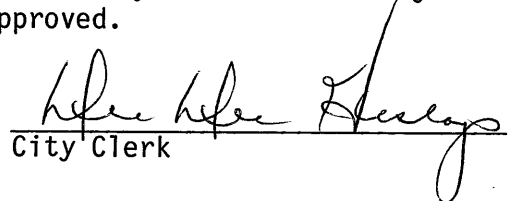
