Willard Payne moved to approve the April 1, 1991 minutes as written. Ken Maynard seconded the motion and all approved.

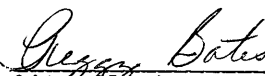
During old business a resolution was introduced establishing a policy and enforcement of a Drug Free Work Force. Karyl Rice moved to approve the resolution as presented. Willard Payne seconded the motion and all approved. Karyl Rice moved to contract with ASB Meditest for drug testing. Willard Payne seconded the motion and all approved.

A public hearing was held to consider rezoning property located on Highway 261 across from Stubbs Foundry from A-1 Agricultural to Special District. The applicant was Mr. Red Hulon. No one spoke in favor or against the rezoning request. Karyl Rice moved to approve Ordinance No. 135-28 rezoning Hulon property as presented. Ken Maynard seconded the motion and all approved.

During new business a resolution installing two street lights at the entrance to Chandalar Subdivision on Chandalar Lane was introduced. Willard Payne moved to approve the resolution as presented. Ken Maynard seconded the motion and all approved.

A request from Sherman Holland to name a street leading to his property Holland Drive was presented. This request was made to facilitate E911 in identifying his property. Paul Yeager stated that the city has disowned the street. Karyl Rice moved to have Mr. Yeager contact E911 and inform them that the City does not own the street and they are free to call it whatever they desire. Ken Maynard seconded the motion and all approved.

With no other business before the Council, Karyl Rice moved to adjourn. Ken Maynard seconded the motion and all approved.
