

The Pelham City Council convened at 7:00 p.m. June 3, 1991. Mayor Hayes called the meeting to order and Willard Payne opened with prayer. A roll call was taken with all members of the Council present.

Karyl Rice moved to approve the May 13, 1991 minutes as written. Willard Payne seconded the motion and all approved.

During Old Business a public hearing was held to consider rezoning property located on Highway 261 from A-1 Agricultural to R-3 Multiple Dwelling District. The property owner is Mr. Herbert F. Pool. Don Murphy spoke in favor of the rezoning. Several residents of Stratford spoke against the rezoning citing additional traffic problems and the possibility of commercial property devaluing their homes. Connie LaBue moved to approve the rezoning request as presented with Ordinance No. 135-29. Jim Phillips seconded the motion, and a vote was taken with the motion passing 5 to 1.

During new business, Mayor Hayes introduced a request by Mr. Pete Ellison to name his street Parkview Drive to assist E911 in locating residences. Willard Payne moved to approve the request as presented. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

Mayor Hayes introduced a resolution advancing \$155 to Dispatch Supervisor Jack Phillips while attending the Associated Public Safety Officers conference scheduled for June 26-28, 1991 at Joe Wheeler State Park. Willard Payne moved to approve the resolution as presented. Jim Phillips seconded the motion and all approved.

Mayor Hayes introduced a resolution advancing \$60 to Officers Davidson and Strickland for expenses while attending a Traffic Accident Analysis Seminar at Auburn, June 18, 1991. Karyl Rice moved to approve the resolution as presented. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and all approved.

Mayor Hayes introduced a street light request from Mr. Clifton J. Moor for Chanbury Drive. Mayor Hayes asked Mike Morgan to check on the location of the light and report back to City Council at their next regularly scheduled meeting.

Mayor Hayes introduced an application for retail beer and retail table wine (off premises) for Sunnyland Food Store. Jim Phillips moved to approve the request as presented. Willard Payne seconded the motion and the motion carried 5 to 1.

A resident of Chandalar asked the Council if anything could be done to limit noise at the Amphitheater during concerts. Mayor Hayes reported that the City attorney is investigating our legal position and hopes to have an ordinance on record soon.

With no other business before the Council, Ken Maynard moved to adjourn. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.
