

The Pelham City Council convened at 7:00 p.m. August 19, 1991. Willard Payne, Mayor pro tem, called the meeting to order and Ken Maynard opened with prayer. A roll call was taken with all members of the Council present except Mayor Hayes and Connie LaBue.

Jim Phillips moved to approve the August 5, 1991 minutes as written. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

During old business, Willard Payne announced that Paul Yeager would have a report on installation of mirrors on Wildwood Drive at the September 9th council meeting.

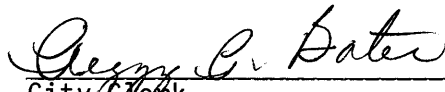
During new business a street light request for Glenview Avenue was introduced. Willard Payne asked that Paul Yeager make a recommendation concerning the need for the light at the next meeting.

A resolution approving installation of street lights at the intersection of Highway 52 and Highway 11 was introduced by Willard Payne. Ken Maynard moved to approve the resolution as presented. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

Two residents from Wooddale Subdivision asked for help with speeding vehicles in their neighborhood. They requested a sidewalk or speed breakers. Willard Payne stated the police would be asked to patrol frequently and do a traffic count, however, no speed breakers would be installed.
