

The Pelham City Council convened at 7:00 p.m. Monday, April 20, 1992. Mayor Hayes called the meeting to order and Ken Maynard opened with prayer.

A roll call was taken with all members of the Council present.

Karyl Rice moved to approve the April 6, 1992 minutes as corrected. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and all approved.

During old business, Ken Maynard moved to deny Faces Sports a restaurant retail liquor license. Willard Payne seconded the motion and all approved.

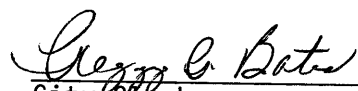
During new business an application for restaurant retail liquor for B S Pub & Grill was presented. Jim Phillips moved to approve the application as presented. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

Mayor Hayes introduced Ordinance No. 228 requiring mobile home parks to post individual address numbers for each mobile home space and Ordinance No. 229 regulating parades, demonstrations and picketing. Both ordinances are to be voted on at the May 11, 1992 council meeting.

Brett Winford requested permit waivers for the scholarship house to be built in the city. Mayor Hayes stated the fees should range from \$400-\$500. Jim Phillips moved to approve the waiver of permit fees as requested. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and all approved.

Connie LaBue announced two public hearings to be held May 11, 1992 at 7:00 p.m. 1) To consider an amendment to the zone district boundaries of the City to change the present zoning of A-1 Agricultural to B-2 General Business District. The property is located on Yeager Parkway. Applicant - Howard and Deloris Lee. 2) To consider an amendment to the zone district boundaries of the City to change present zoning from M-2 Heavy Industrial to R-1 Single Family. The property is located adjacent to Weatherly. Applicant - Charlene H. Scott and J. A. Brown Co., Inc.

With no other business before the Council, Ken Maynard moved to adjourn. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.
