

The Pelham City Council convened at 7:00 p.m., Monday, October 19, 1992. Mayor Hayes called the meeting to order and Willard Payne opened with prayer.

Mayor Hayes asked for the record to show that all members of the Council were present.

Connie LaBue moved to approve the September 21, October 5, and October 12, 1992 minutes as written. Ken Maynard seconded the motion and all approved.

During old business, Mayor Hayes gave a report on the feasibility study being conducted regarding purchasing the sewer system. He announced the City was awaiting word from the insurance company and will close December 1, 1992, if all goes as planned.

Mayor Hayes announced that the City will begin recycling after the first of the year with BFI for the same monthly fee the residents are now paying.

During new business, Ordinance No. 130-9 was introduced, amending the real estate sales portion of the business license ordinance. Jim Phillips moved to suspend the rules for immediate consideration. Ken Maynard seconded the motion and all approved. Thereupon, Jim Phillips moved to approve Ordinance No. 130-9 as presented. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

A resolution was introduced advancing \$117 to cover expenses for Captain Steve Powell and Lt. VanHooser while attending the annual meeting and conference of the Fire Marshals Association of Alabama. Willard Payne moved to approve the resolution as presented. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and all approved.

A resolution was introduced advancing \$200 to Alan Salter while attending the National Park & Recreation Conference. Connie LaBue moved to approve the resolution as presented. Willard Payne seconded the motion and all approved.

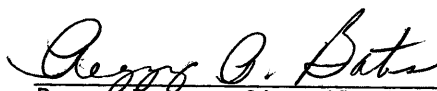
A resolution was presented authorizing the city to accept the responsibility for lighting seven street lights in Brookshire. Karyl Rice moved to approve the resolution as presented. Ken Maynard seconded the motion and all approved.

An application for lounge retail liquor CL I was presented for Randy Glenn's. Jim Phillips moved to approve the application as presented. Willard Payne seconded the motion and the application was approved with a 5 to 1 vote.

An application for retail beer and retail wine - on and off premise for Poppa's was introduced. Jim Phillips moved to approve the application as presented. Willard Payne seconded the motion and the application was approved with a 5 to 1 vote.

Mayor Hayes read a proclamation naming October 24 - November 1, 1992 as Red Ribbon Week in the City of Pelham and encouraged citizens to participate in drug prevention education activities. He announced a program on drug abuse to be held at city hall October 21, 1992, at 9:00 a.m.

With no other business before the Council, Connie LaBue moved to adjourn. Willard Payne seconded the motion and all approved.
