

The Pelham City Council convened at 7:00 p.m., Monday, June 21, 1993. Mayor Hayes called the meeting to order and Ken Maynard opened with prayer.

Mayor Hayes asked that the record show all council members present.

Karyl Rice moved to approve the June 7, 1993, minutes as written. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and all approved.

During old business Paul Yeager reported on the ditch in Stratford Place. He informed the Council that he had spoken to the developers, Donnie Tucker and John Ramer, and they disagreed on who was responsible for cleaning the ditch. He told them there would be no more inspections until it was cleaned up.

During new business Ordinance No. 240 was presented annexing property near Highway 119 adjoining Summer Place. The property consists of seven lots. Jim Phillips moved to suspend the rules for immediate consideration of Ordinance No. 240. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and a roll call vote was taken with all members of the council agreeing to suspend the rules. Thereupon Jim Phillips moved to approve Ordinance No. 240 as presented. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

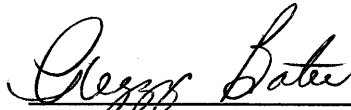
