Ken Maynard moved to approve the October 4, 1993, minutes as written. Willard Payne seconded the motion and all approved.

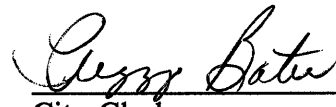
During old business, Mayor Hayes announced the cancellation of a public hearing to consider closing a portion of Keystone Street.

During new business, a proclamation naming October School Board Member Recognition Month was read and signed by Mayor Hayes.

Mayor Hayes introduced Ordinance No. 116-2 amending the dog ordinance to prohibit dogs within the confines or property boundary of any Pelham Municipal Park or Mini-Park. Jim Phillips moved to suspend the rules for immediate consideration. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and a roll call vote was taken with all members of the Council agreeing to suspend the rules. Thereupon, Jim Phillips moved and Karyl Rice seconded the motion to approve Ordinance No. 116-2 as written and the ordinance passed unanimously.

Mayor Hayes announced a drug education/awareness program to be held at City Hall October 28, 1993, at 10:00 a.m.

With no other business before the Council, Karyl Rice moved to adjourn. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and all approved.
