

The Pelham City Council convened at 7:00 p.m., Monday, November 15, 1993. Mayor Hayes called the meeting to order and Willard Payne opened with prayer. Mayor Hayes asked that the record show all members of the Council present.

Willard Payne moved to approve the November 1, 1993, minutes as presented. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and all approved.

During old business a public hearing was held to consider rezoning property located at Valley Commercial Park from B-2 to M-1. Jim Strickland represented Jim Adams, the applicant. It was noted that this rezoning included one parcel owned by P. J. Frost. There was no opposition to the request. Karyl Rice moved to approve the rezoning as requested. Jim Phillips seconded the motion and Ordinance No. 135-43 rezoning the Adams and Frost property passed unanimously.

A resolution was presented authorizing Alabama Power to install and bill the City for two street lights to be located on Indianwood Terrace. Ken Maynard moved to approve the resolution as presented. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

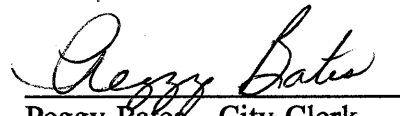
During new business Mayor Hayes presented a proclamation to John Chapin recognizing him as Pelham's official Santa Claus.

A resolution appointing Martha Murphy and Ann Sullivan to full terms on the Library Board was presented. Ken Maynard moved to approve the resolution as presented. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

A resolution closing Amphitheater Road for Holiday in Lights was presented. Dan Williams, a resident, was pleased to see the road open during the day. He questioned who put up the fence and the money involved. Jim Phillips moved to approve the resolution as presented. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and all approved.

Mayor Hayes introduced an ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 205 - requiring sprinklers in hotels. He also introduced an ordinance regulating false alarms. Both ordinances will be voted on at the next council meeting.

With no other business before the Council, Willard Payne moved to adjourn. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.
