Karyl Rice moved to approve the March 21, 1994, minutes as written. Jim Phillips seconded the motion and all approved.

There was no old business to come before the council.

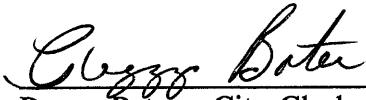
During new business a petition to deannex the Argo property was presented. Ordinance No. 251 was introduced. Jim Phillips moved to suspend the rules for immediate consideration. Ken Maynard seconded the motion, and a roll call vote was taken with all members agreeing to suspend the rules. Thereupon Jim Phillips moved to approve Ordinance No. 251 deannexing Argo property. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Karyl Rice announced a public hearing to be held April 18, 1994, at 7:00 p.m. to consider an amendment to the zone district boundaries of the City changing the present zoning of A-1 Agricultural to B-2 General Business on property located off Highway 52 known as the Oates property. The applicant is Steve Lee.

A resolution was presented designating Bill Overstreet the City's agent as a contact for the Alabama Emergency Management Agency for disaster assistance. Connie LaBue moved to approve the resolution as presented. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

Marty Connors of BFI offered their help with cleaning up the storm debris and commended the city for the way things were handled.

With no other business before the Council, Ken Maynard moved to adjourn. Willard Payne seconded the motion and all approved.
