

The Pelham City Council convened at 7:00 p.m., Monday, May 2, 1994. Mayor Hayes called the meeting to order, and Ken Maynard lead the invocation.

Mayor Hayes asked that the record show all members of the Council present except Karyl Rice.

Connie LaBue moved to approve the minutes of the April 18, 1994, meeting as presented. Willard Payne seconded the motion and all approved.

There was no old business to come before the Council.

During new business an application for retail beer and table wine (off premise) for Winn-Dixie was presented. Jim Phillips moved to approve the application. Willard Payne seconded the motion and it carried four to one.

Ordinance No. 253 was introduced annexing Goggans property. Willard Payne moved to suspend the rules for immediate consideration. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and a roll call vote was taken with all members of the council agreeing to suspend the rules. Thereupon, Jim Phillips moved to approve Ordinance No. 253 as presented. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and all approved.

Mayor Hayes read a proclamation recognizing the City Clerk and proclaimed May 1-7 Municipal Clerk's Week.

A resolution was presented advancing \$75 to Officer Tom Walker to cover expenses while attending the Alabama Narcotics Association Training Seminar in Montgomery, AL, May 4-6, 1994. Willard Payne moved to approve the resolution as presented. Ken Maynard seconded the motion and all approved.

A resolution concerning cleaning up Bishop Creek was presented for consideration. Ken Maynard moved to approve the resolution as presented. Jim Phillips seconded the motion and all approved.

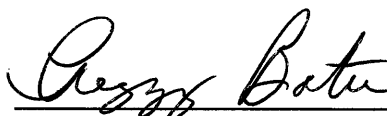
