

PELHAM BEAUTIFICATION BOARD MEETING
March 5, 2013

A meeting of the Pelham Beautification Board was called to order at 6:00 pm by Gwen Kaminski at Pelham City Hall on Tuesday, March 5, 2013. Present were board members Gwen Kaminski, Mosely Johnson, Neville Peacock, David Russell, Joel Price and Ashley Miller Anderson. Board members absent were Betsy Whitfield, Darlene Webb and Jeff Speegle. Also present were Mayor Gary Waters, Council Member Maurice Mercer and Paula Holly.

ROLL CALL

It was determined that a quorum was present in order to conduct business.

MINUTES

Ms. Peacock made a motion to approve the minutes as amended of the February 5, 2013 meeting. Mr. Russell seconded the motion and the minutes were unanimously approved by a vote of members present.

OLD BUSINESS

Ms. Holly informed the board the County Commission chose April 6 and October 5 as the 2013 Free Landfill Dates. Paula also let the board know she has scheduled Cinta's Document Shredding and Technical Knock-out to provide free document shredding and e-recycling to the city residents at city hall on April 6th in conjunction with the heavy trash pickup by Allied Waste.

Ms. Holly presented the submitted names for the Rename Pelham Pride Day Contest. The submitted names are Pelham Pride Day, Keep Pelham Clean Day, CommUNITY Day, Pelham City Fest, Pelham Fun Day, Best of Pelham Day, Experience Pelham Day, Pelham Palooza, Pelham Summerfest, Pelhambration and Experience the Pelham Renaissance. All Beautification Board members cast their votes and Pelhambration was unanimously chosen. Ms. Holly will notify the winner, Ms. Tanya Crocker.

Ms. Kaminski requested the board review the bullet points of The 50th Birthday Celebration and for the members to continue to think about and form ideas for this event next year. It was requested by the board that the Mayor include a line item in the 2014 budget for this event. In addition to the attached birthday ideas, it was suggested that if we do a time capsule that it be opened on at the 75th birthday celebration. Ms. Holly confirmed the dates of July 11-12, 2014 have already been reserved at the Pelham Civic Complex & Ice Arena.

Councilmember Maurice Mercer addressed the board regarding his idea of hosting a Taste of Pelham as either part of the Pelhambration event or as a separate fundraising event for the Library Guild. After discussion, the board opted to keep the two events separate at this time.

NEW BUSINESS

Mayor Waters addressed the board regarding the exciting opportunity in front of us as we begin our Pelhambration event. He also shared with the board that the city is looking to secure a Hockey Tournament and Figure Skating event in 2014 & 2015.

Ms. Kaminski had the board review the attached list of ideas for Pelhambration. Ms. Holly spoke to the board regarding the time line for setup with Veal Services. The Pelham Civic Complex & Ice Arena has been reserved from July 12th in the evening and all day on July 13th. Vintage Gray has been retained a live music for the venue. Ms. Kaminski also brought up discussion regarding "on-the-hour-events" to spur discussion.

Discussion was held regarding committee ideas, booth size and registration amount, civic organizations and community involvement. Ms. Kaminski, Mr. Johnson and Ms. Peacock will meet separately to head up the formation of the Pelhambration Committee.

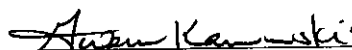
