

The Pelham City Council convened at 7:00 p.m., October 17, 1994. Mayor Hayes called the meeting to order and Willard Payne lead the invocation.

Mayor Hayes asked that the record show all members of the council present except Jim Phillips.

Ken Maynard moved to approve the October 3, 1994 minutes as presented. Willard Payne seconded the motion and all approved.

There was no old business to come before the council.

During new business Ordinance No. 257-1 amending the Education Incentive Ordinance was presented. Willard Payne moved to suspend the rules for immediate consideration of the ordinance. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and a roll call vote was taken with the following results: Ayes - Mayor Hayes, Willard Payne, Connie LaBue, Ken Maynard and Karyl Rice. Willard Payne then moved to approve the ordinance as presented. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and all approved.

Ordinance No. 156-1 was presented amending the sewer ordinance. Ken Maynard moved to suspend the rules for immediate consideration of the ordinance. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and a roll call vote was taken with the following results: Ayes - Mayor Hayes, Willard Payne, Connie LaBue, Ken Maynard and Karyl Rice. Ken Maynard then moved to approve the ordinance as presented. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

A resolution advancing \$418 to Officer Jeff Smith to cover expenses while attending a Crime Scene Workshop by the Mississippi Division of the International Association for Identification in Louisville, Mississippi was presented. Willard Payne moved to approve the resolution as presented. Connie LaBue seconded the motion and all approved.

Ruth Crenshaw, Coach for the Math Team from Pelham High School, and several math team members thanked Mayor Hayes and the City Council for their support.

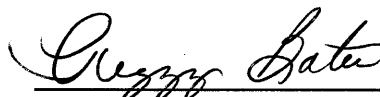
