A request from Heather Ridge residents for stop signs and a hidden driveway sign was given to Paul Yeager for investigation and reporting at the next council meeting.

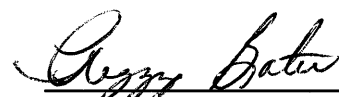
