

The Pelham City Council convened at 7:00 p.m., Monday, March 20, 1995. Ken Maynard, Mayor Pro Tem, called the meeting to order. Willard Payne lead the invocation. Mr. Maynard asked that the record show all members of the council present except Mayor Hayes.

There was no old business to come before the council.

During new business, Connie LaBue read a proclamation for Youth Art Month.

A resolution was introduced advancing \$200 to Richard Findley to cover expenses while attending ADEM Operator Training and Certification April 9-11, 1995, in Mobile, AL. Connie LaBue moved to approve the resolution as presented. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

A resolution was introduced advancing \$480 to Dispatch Supervisor Jack Phillips to cover expenses while he, Dispatcher Thorson and Dispatcher Coggins attend the April Conference of the APCO Public Safety Communication organization in Dothan, AL, April 25-28, 1995.

A resolution was introduced authorizing Alabama Power to install four street lights at the intersection of U.S. 31 and the Pelham WalMart Store. Willard Payne moved to approve the resolution as presented. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

A resolution was introduced authorizing Alabama Power to install a traffic signal at the intersection of WalMart and Highway 31. Connie LaBue moved to approve the resolution as presented. Jim Phillips seconded the motion and all approved.

An application for restaurant retail liquor from Hideaway Patio and Grill was introduced. Patti Jordan stated it was a restaurant, not a bar. Connie LaBue moved to approve the application as presented. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and it carried with a vote of three to two.

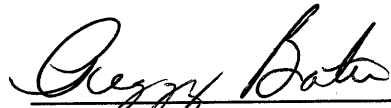
Karyl Rice announced two public hearings to be held April 10, 1995 at 7:00 p.m.
