

The Pelham City Council convened Monday, August 21, 1995, at 7:00 p.m. Mayor Hayes called the meeting to order and Willard Payne lead the invocation. Mayor Hayes asked that the record show all members of the council present except Connie LaBue.

There was no old business to come before the council.

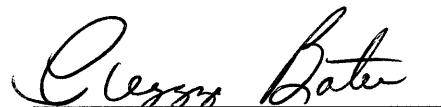
A resolution was introduced authorizing street lights at 1808 Trailridge Drive, Highway 11 at Deer Springs Grocery and 2315 Kristen Drive. Paul Yeager reported that a light could not be placed at 2315 Kristen Drive because the pole was on private property. Ken Maynard moved to approve the resolution striking the Kristen Drive location. Willard Payne seconded the motion and all approved.

Ordinance No. 272 vacating a portion of the easement on Lot 27 at Chase Creek Townhomes was presented. Jim Phillips moved to suspend the rules for immediate consideration. Ken Maynard seconded the motion and a roll call vote was taken with the following vote recorded: Bobby Hayes, yes; Willard Payne, yes; Connie LaBue, absent; Ken Maynard, yes; Karyl Rice, yes and Jim Phillips, yes. Jim Phillips then moved to approve Ordinance No. 272 as written. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

A resolution was introduced advancing \$1,450 to Captain E. A. Thomas to cover expenses while attending the 10 week polygraph examiners training in Atlanta, Georgia; \$1,500 to Sgt. Mark Hall to cover expenses while attending the 11 week FBI National Academy in Quantico, Virginia October through December; and \$125 each for the members of the Firefighter Combat Challenge Team representing the city at the regional competition in Louisville, KY, September 9-10, 1995. The members are Lt. Mike Knight, F/M Ken Camp, F/F Russ Compton, F/F Scott Cates and F/F Scott Ousley (alternate). Willard Payne moved to approve the resolution as presented. Ken Maynard seconded the motion and all approved.

Jason Daggett, track coach, from Pelham High School, and Sandy Walton presented a request for a \$5,000 donation toward a \$23,000 loan to make improvements to the running track at Pelham High School. Paul Yeager stated that the county commission was not contributing to the project. Mayor Hayes explained that we do not designate how the contribution to Pelham High School is to be spent. Tom Ferguson determines how the money is to be used.

With no other business before the council, Karyl Rice moved to adjourn. Jim Phillips seconded the motion and all approved.
