

The Pelham City Council convened at 7:00 p.m., Monday, November 18, 1996. Mayor Hayes called the meeting to order and Ken Maynard led the invocation.

Mayor Hayes asked that the record show all members of the council present except Jim Phillips.

Ken Maynard moved to approve the November 4, 1996 minutes as written. Willard Payne seconded the motion and all approved.

During old business, Ordinance No. 288 revising the business license schedule was presented. Willard Payne moved to approve the ordinance as written. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

Ordinance No. 289, establishing a tax on gasoline and gasoline products was presented. Ken Maynard moved to approve the ordinance as written. Mike Dickens seconded the motion and all approved.

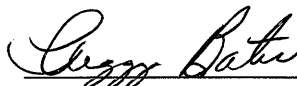
A public hearing was held to consider Ordinance No. 135-76 changing the zoning of property located on Highway 261 from R-1 Residential to B-1 Business District. The applicant was Donnie Tucker. Donnie Tucker stated that the property consisted of .8 acre and that he had no plans at this time to develop the property. Residents expressed concern about water flow. Ken Maynard moved to approve the rezoning as requested. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

Willard Payne moved to table a public hearing to consider Ordinance No. 135-72 until January 20, 1997 to allow time for research by attorney. Mike Dickens seconded the motion and all approved.

During new business, Ordinance No. 241-1 amending the garbage fee was presented. Willard Payne moved to suspend the rules for immediate consideration. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and a roll call vote was taken with all members answering yes to suspend the rules. Thereupon Karyl Rice moved to approve Ordinance No. 231-1 as presented. Willard Payne seconded the motion and all approved. *241-1 pb*

A resident from Stratford asked to address the council concerning debris created by flyers, hand mail and garage sale signs. He asked that the council pass an ordinance to regulate the distribution of these items. Mayor Hayes stated that he would research the subject.

With no other business before the council, Mike Dickens moved to adjourn. Willard Payne seconded the motion and all approved.
