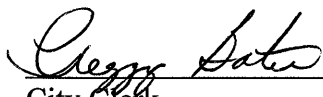
Thereupon, Willard Payne moved to approve Ordinance No. 306 as presented. Jim Phillips seconded the motion and all approved.
