

The Pelham City Council convened at 7:00 p.m., Monday, March 2, 1998. Mayor Hayes called the meeting to order and Ken Maynard led the invocation.

Mayor Hayes asked that the record show all members of the council present.

Ken Maynard moved to approve the February 16 minutes as written. Willard Payne seconded the motion and all approved.

There was no old business to come before the council.

Mayor Hayes stated that he would pass the information on to store owners and get their input.
