

The Pelham City Council convened at 7:00 p.m., Monday, April 20, 1998. Willard Payne led the invocation and Mayor Hayes asked that the record show all members of the council present. Karyl Rice moved and Willard Payne seconded the motion to approve the April 6 minutes as written. The motion passed unanimously.

There was no old business to come before the council.

During new business, Ordinance No. 323 was introduced amending Chapter 5, Article I of the Code of Ordinances to require that business licenses that are based on certain community standards criteria be approved by the city council prior to issuance. Jim Phillips moved and Mike Dickens seconded the motion to suspend the rules for immediate consideration. A roll call vote was taken with the following results:

An application and resolution was presented for lounge retail liquor CL I for Pub 261. Mr. Lee spoke on behalf of Pub 261. Willard Payne moved to approve the application as presented. Mike Dickens seconded the motion, and it passed with a five to one vote.

An application and resolution was presented for retail beer and retail table wine (on/off premise) for Creoles Market and Cafe. Mr. Donner spoke on behalf of Creoles Market. Jim Phillips moved to approve the application as presented. Mike Dickens seconded the motion and it passed with a five to one vote.

Dwayne Donner addressed the city council explaining how he plans to develop property on Highway 31 for outside dining. He stated that the only music would be background music.

A resolution advancing cash to the following was introduced:

\$315 to Fire Medic David Payne for expenses while traveling with the Pelham High School Band to the 1998 Festival of Champions Concert Band Festival in Clearwater, Florida, April 22-25, 1998.

Jim Phillips moved to approve the resolution as presented. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

A resolution was presented approving bond financing. Ken Maynard moved to approve the resolution as written. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

Ordinance No. 322 was presented approving \$17,805,000 in bonds for the purpose of refinancing the 1992 sewer bonds. Willard Payne moved to suspend the rules for immediate consideration. Ken Maynard seconded the motion and a roll call vote was taken with the following results:

Thereupon Willard Payne moved to approve Ordinance No. 322 as written. Ken Maynard seconded the motion and all approved.

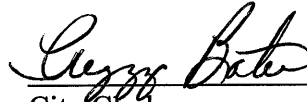
Mr. John Wright of Weatherly presented concerns about their subdivision.
