

The Pelham City Council convened at 7:00 p.m., Monday, June 1, 1998. Mayor Hayes called the meeting to order and Ken Maynard led the invocation. Mayor Hayes asked that the record show all members of the council present except Jim Phillips.

Mike Dickens moved to approve the May 18 minutes as written. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

There was no old business to come before the council.

During new business, Ordinance No. 88-4 was presented amending Section 1 of Ordinance No. 88-3 to include the same tax for house trailers as automobiles. Willard Payne moved to suspend the rules for immediate consideration. Ken Maynard seconded the motion, and a roll call vote was taken with the following results:

Thereupon, Ken Maynard moved and Mike Dickens seconded the motion that Ordinance No. 88-4 be approved as written. The motion carried unanimously.

A resolution was presented advancing cash to the following: \$1,500 to Sgt. Mark Delk to cover expenses during his attendance at the FBI National Academy from June 28 through September 11, 1998 and \$250 to Peggy Bates to cover expenses during her attendance at Professional Development for Women in Atlanta, Georgia, June 10, 1998. Willard Payne moved to approve the resolution as presented. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

A resolution revoking the business license of Jason Martens was introduced. Officer Scott Tucker reported that the police department had received numerous complaints concerning working after hours and asking personal questions. Ken Maynard moved to approve the resolution as presented. Mike Dickens seconded the motion and all approved.

A resolution was presented authorizing the city to pay \$36 each for four board members to attend a workshop on Basic Zoning and Subdivision Regulation hosted by The Alabama Planning Institute June 11 in Pelham. Karyl Rice moved to approve the resolution as presented. Ken Maynard seconded the motion and all approved.

Mayor Hayes read a proclamation designating June 21 as empty pocket and purse day in the City of Pelham.

Keven Giles addressed the city council requesting a three way stop sign at the corner of King Valley Street and King Valley Drive and for assistance with a flooding problem in King Valley. Mayor Hayes said he would ask the city engineer to do a study to see if a stop sign was warranted and he would get the flooding problem corrected.

The following public hearings were announced for the June 15 council meeting.

- 1) Ordinance No. 135-98 to consider rezoning property located on Clark Street from B-4 General Business to M-1 Light Industrial District. Applicant - Randy Jordan
- 2) Ordinance No. 135-99 to consider rezoning property on Shelby County Highway 33 from B-2 General Business to M-1 Light Industrial District. Applicant - Johnny Busby

Mayor Hayes recognized Eagle Scout Daniel Taylor.

With no other business before the council, Willard Payne moved to adjourn. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.
