

The Pelham City Council convened at 7:00 p.m., Monday, September 13, 1999. Mayor Hayes called the meeting to order, and Willard Payne led the invocation.

Mayor Hayes asked that the record show all members of the council present.

Karyl Rice moved to approve the August 16 minutes as written. Willard Payne seconded the motion and all approved.

There was no old business to come before the council.

Mayor Hayes introduced a resolution approving the addition of Joy Love Murphy's name to the memorial stone at the city park. Ken Maynard moved to approve the resolution as read. Mike Dickens seconded the motion and all approved.

A resolution and ABC Application was submitted for 050 Retail Beer (Off Premises) for applicant, Spur One Stop, Inc., Trade Name - Country Grocer at 3118 County Road 52. Jim Phillips moved to approve the application as presented. Mike Dickens seconded the motion and it passed five to one.

Willard Payne announced a public hearing to be held September 20 at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall to consider Ordinance No. 135-113 changing the present zoning of A-1 Agricultural District to Special District and R-1 Residential District. The applicants are Patrick A. And Thomas Thornton.

Mayor Hayes recognized JoAnn Carroll for her service to the city. He proclaimed September 13, 1999, JoAnn Carroll Day in the City of Pelham, and presented Ms. Carroll with flowers and a key to the city.

Mayor Hayes recognized Scout Casey Callaway working on his citizenship badge.
