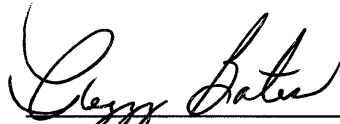
Thereupon Willard Payne moved to approve Ordinance No. 344 as written. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.
