

The Pelham City Council convened at 7:00 p.m., Monday, October 4, 1999. Willard Payne, Mayor Pro-Tem called the meeting to order. Karyl Rice led the invocation. Mr. Payne asked that the record show all members of the council present except Mayor Hayes.

Karyl Rice moved to approve the September 20 minutes as written. Jim Phillips seconded the motion and all approved.

During old business, a public hearing was held to consider Ordinance No. 135-114 changing the present zoning of B-4 to M-1 Light Industrial District on property located on Clark Street. The applicant was Don Murphy. No one spoke in favor or opposition of the request. It was noted that the Planning Commission recommended rezoning. Karyl Rice moved to approve Ordinance No. 135-114 as presented. Jim Phillips seconded the motion and all approved.

During new business an ABC application and resolution approving 020 Restaurant Retail Liquor for Las Americas was presented. Jim Phillips moved to approve the application and resolution contingent on correcting 6B. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and it passed four to one.

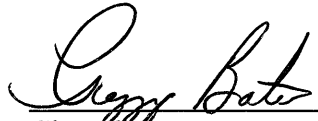
Willard Payne read a proclamation naming the month of October Domestic Violence Month.

Karyl Rice announced a public hearing to be held October 18, 1999, to consider Ordinance No. 135-115 changing the present zoning of A-1 Agricultural to Special District. The property is located at Windstone III Subdivision off County Road 36, ½ mile east of County Road 69. The applicant is Rodney Davis.

With no other business before the council, Mike Dickens moved to adjourn and Karyl Rice seconded the motion. With all in favor, the meeting adjourned at 7:10 p.m.
