

The Pelham City Council convened at 7:00 p.m., Monday, February 7, 2000. Mayor Pro Tem Willard Payne called the meeting to order, and Karyl Rice led the invocation. Mayor Pro Tem Payne asked that the record show all members of the council present except Mayor Hayes.

Ken Maynard moved to approve the January 17 minutes as presented. Mike Dickens seconded the motion, and all approved.

There was no old business to come before the council.

During new business, a resolution was introduced granting permission to Tritel Communications, Inc. to collocate an antennae to an existing tower on Parkview Drive. Karyl Rice moved to approve the resolution as presented. Jim Phillips seconded the motion, and all approved.

An ABC Application and resolution was presented for A Fare To Remember. The application requested a 160 Special Retail/More than 30 Days license. Jim Phillips moved to approve the application as presented. Karyl Rice seconded the motion, and it passed with a vote of four to one.

An ABC Application and resolution was presented for Challenger's. The application requested an 020 Restaurant Retail Liquor license. Jim Phillips moved to approve the application and resolution as presented. Mike Dickens seconded the motion, and it passed with a vote of four to one.

A resolution was presented approving Alabama Power billing the City of Pelham for two existing street lights - Indian Lake Trail Pole #E733 and Helena Road Pole #E732. Ken Maynard moved to approve the resolution as presented. Mike Dickens seconded the motion, and all approved.

Karyl Rice announced that a public hearing would be held on February 21 at 7:00 p.m. to consider Ordinance No. 135-112 changing the present zoning of R-1 Residential District & B-2 General Business District to Special District. The property is located on Highway 261 and Mitoba Trail, and requested by applicant Southeastern Property Development, Inc.

Mayor Pro Tem Payne recognized Troop 404 from First Baptist of Pelham and also Troop 5.

With no other business before the city council, Ken Maynard moved to adjourn. Mike Dickens seconded the motion, and all approved. The meeting adjourned at 7:10 p.m.
