

The Pelham City Council met July 3, 2000 at 7:00 p.m. Mayor Hayes called the meeting to order, and Ken Maynard led the invocation. Mayor Hayes asked that the record show all members of the council present except Mike Dickens.

Karyl Rice moved to waive the oral reading of the June 19, 2000 minutes and approve as written. Ken Maynard seconded the motion and all approved.

During old business Ordinance No. 359 de-annexing Bill Martin’s property was presented. Ken Maynard asked why Mr. Martin wished to de-annex. He stated that he wished to bring horses in and have less regulations. Jim Phillips moved to approve Ordinance No. 359 as written. Willard Payne seconded the motion and all approved.

During new business Ordinance No. 364 was presented annexing Barney E. Champion, Jr. and Martha C. Champion’s property at 3468 Indian Lake Circle. Karyl Rice moved to suspend the rules for immediate consideration. Jim Phillips seconded the motion, and a roll call vote was taken with the following results.

A resolution adding the name of David Walters to the obelisk at the city park was presented. Jim Phillips moved to approve the resolution as presented. Ken Maynard seconded the motion and all approved.

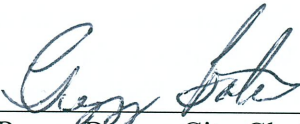
