

The Pelham City Council convened at 7:00 p.m., Monday, August 21, 2000. Mayor Hayes called the meeting to order and Willard Payne led the invocation.

Mayor Hayes asked that the record show all members of the council present.

Ken Maynard moved to waive the oral reading of the minutes and approve as written. Willard Payne seconded the motion and all approved.

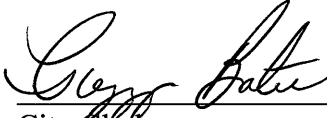
During old business, a public hearing was held to consider Ordinance No. 135-123 changing the present zoning of A-1 Agricultural to B-2 General Business District on property located on Vance Street. The applicant was Joe Rose. Mr. Rose addressed the council and explained that he wanted to build an office warehouse building. Karyl Rice moved to approve the request as presented. Jim Phillips seconded the motion and all approved.

During new business, a resolution was presented declaring a state of emergency regarding water pressure to the southern part of Pelham and authorizing the Mayor to proceed immediately with negotiations to construct a new water storage tank, production well and necessary lines connecting the two. Jim Phillips moved to approve the resolution as presented. Willard Payne seconded the motion and all approved.

An ABC application and resolution was presented for Big Daddy's Sports Cafe - 020 Restaurant Retail Liquor. Ron Marlow, attorney for applicant, showed the council a menu and stated that all gaming would be taken out. Ken Maynard wanted to know what percentage of sales would come from alcohol. Jim Phillips moved to approve the application as presented. Mike Dickens seconded the motion and it passed with a five to one vote.

Mayor Hayes announced that the next council meeting would be September 11 due to Labor Day.

With no other business before the council, Ken Maynard moved to adjourn. Willard Payne seconded the motion and all approved. The meeting adjourned at 7:15 p.m.
