Mayor Hayes announced that the council needed to appoint a Mayor Pro Tem. Jim Phillips moved to appoint Mike Dickens. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.

Mayor Hayes announced the following council and committee appointments:

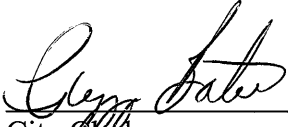
