

The Pelham City Council convened at 7:00 p.m., Monday, April 2, 2001. Mayor Hayes called the meeting to order, and Willard Payne led the invocation.

Mayor Hayes recognized Susan Hawkins from SafeHouse and read a proclamation designating April Sexual Assault Awareness Month.

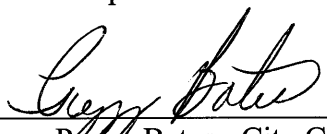
