

The Pelham City Council convened at 7:00 p.m., Monday, June 4, 2001. Mayor Hayes called the meeting to order, and Willard Payne led the invocation.

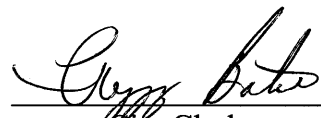
