

The Pelham City Council convened at 7 p.m. Monday, April 21, 2003. Mayor Hayes called the meeting to order, and Karyl Rice led the invocation.

Mayor Hayes asked that the record show all members of the council present except Mike Dickens.

Willard Payne moved to waive the oral reading of the April 7 minutes and approve as written. Rosemary Metcalf seconded the motion and all approved.

During old business, a public hearing was held to consider Ordinance No. 135-145 changing the present zoning of A-1 Agricultural District to R-1 Residential District on property located off SC 336. Applicant Al Knight spoke for the zoning request. No one spoke against the request. Karyl Rice moved to approve Ordinance No. 135-145 as presented. Willard Payne seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

During new business, Mayor Hayes presented resolutions and an ALDOT agreement for Project No. STPBH-7012 (603) SR-3 (US-31) from I-65 to SR-261 (CR-17) Fiber Optics and traffic signal improvements. Willard Payne moved to approve as presented. Rosemary Metcalf seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

A resolution was presented authorizing Mayor Hayes to execute FY 2003 Community Development Block Grant application certifications committing matching funds and sufficient resources to maintain the proposed senior citizens facility. Jim Phillips moved to approve the resolution as presented. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

An ABC application and resolution was presented for 070 Retail Table Wine (Off Premises Only) for Applicant – Broken Post Steak & Wine located at 2961 B Highway 31 South. Jim Phillips moved to approve as presented. Rosemary Metcalf seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Mayor Hayes read the Municipal Clerks Week Proclamation designating April 27-May 3 Municipal Clerks Week in Pelham.

With no other business before the council, Willard Payne moved to adjourn. Karyl Rice seconded the motion and all approved.
